Course Information

This course is a 3-credit advanced elective, focused on the medium of photography and will take place in the spring semester of 2020. Through readings, research, and image-making students will work on developing their visual storytelling skills. A part of the course is an engagement with the large Azorean community living in Lowell, MA and exploration of their connections with the mid-Atlantic islands they left behind. Students with previous photography experience are encouraged to apply, but students from other humanities related programs would be strongly considered.
