Our faculty-led Study Abroad Programs allow you to immerse yourself in another history, people, and culture in an enriching course through international travel.

We are excited to announce that, for the third year in a row, we are offering World Ready Scholarships for students enrolled in the College of Fine Arts, Humanities, and Social Sciences who wish to take advantage of these programs during the 2018-2019 academic year. Travel to Cuba, Spain, Italy, France or other destinations with a UMass Lowell faculty member and enrich your academic, cultural, and geographical knowledge while earning UML course credit (3-15-credit options available).

The college will award scholarships of \$500 each, in the form of a credit towards the billable UMass costs. Additional scholarships may be available from individual Departments and Programs. Students can inquire directly with their departments/program.

To apply for a World Ready Scholarship, submit a completed scholarship application (attached) to the Office of Study Abroad by January 22, 2019 for spring classes with international programs and March 15, 2019 for summer classes with international programs.
